"You should probably ask my wife, Tina," he said, as he reflected on how much she and their children – Vonzell, Lauren and Elyse – sacrificed for his job. He says he can't thank them enough. People see him throughout the school day and at meetings, but there's so much more that happens behind the scenes.

"I can't tell you how many times we've met on a Saturday afternoon, a Sunday morning into Sunday evening making sure students came back to a setting that's as normal as appropriate given the circumstances that happened over the weekend."

Like the phone call he got one night about the bio pond flooding.

"It rained and rained and rained and all of a sudden water's spilling into G building. We have tunnels under school (that there are probably many legends about) but those tunnels began to flood, and they access the boilers and the generators. That is not a good thing. So those are all the things mechanically that go on behind the scenes that are far from the learning happening," he said.

Some decisions are really tough, and he acknowledges they're hard to make and everybody isn't always happy.

"There are no problems, there are only solutions because no matter what the problem is you may not like the solution – hopefully you do – but there will always be a solution," he said.

The future

As superintendent, Mansfield has received numerous honors. Most recently, he was named the 2022 Illinois Association of Superintendents Association

Superintendent of Distinction, and he was a twotime winner of the Those Who Excel Award from the Illinois State Board of Education. He may take his expertise into a college classroom or work as a consultant.

He has served as a College Board trustee and a member of the College Board Executive Committee and the College Board Superintendents' Advisory Panel. He plans on continuing his service as vice chair of the College Board's Oak Circle for former trustees.

"We meet quarterly. I found that to be rewarding work as we still impact a lot of people at a lot of different levels," he said.

Mansfield, now in his early 60s, considers himself a life-long learner. He expects to challenge himself in whatever his next pursuit is "and continue to do those things that make me happy."

"All of us — whether we are students, teachers, staff, administrators, board or community members, or other stakeholders — have benefitted from Dr. Mansfield's wisdom, his 30+ years experience as an educator, his mastery of school finance, his fierce advocacy for principles of diversity, inclusion and equity, and for me personally, his mentorship and friendship. He has captained H-F through many a stormy sea and has left H-F much better off than he found it. More than that, he has positioned us for generations of future success, and for that, we all can be grateful."
