The Artisan Street Fair will run from 4 to 9 p.m. Friday, June 3, and 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday, June 4, on Martin Avenue from Ridge Road to Hickory Road and Hickory Road from Dixie Highway to Harwood Avenue.

The event will feature more than 80 artists and crafters displaying their work, plus live music, food and activities for young and old.

The event also will feature the bike raffle sponsored by the Homewood Business Association and GoodSpeed Cycles.

The two events lead a summer lineup that appears to be as full of opportunities to gather as residents did in any pre-pandemic season.
